

It should be no surprise that not everyone on the expansion/renovation team is a Pi Phil After the Arizona Alpha Chapter House Corporation (CHC) set forth their vision, they carefully and thoughtfully assembled a team of experts to help transform Arizona Alpha's historic home into a modern classic.


The first requirement in pursuing such a massive endeavor is to ensure that funds are in place. For that piece, CHC tapped Tucson's Fraternity Management Group, headed by Arizona Wildcat and Kappa Sigma Matt Noble. With Matt's guidance, we were able to put together a top notch campaign. He is the reason that, thus far, we've raised over one million dollars toward the nearly three million dollar price tag for this



bers' bills as low as possible and ensure that Arizona Alpha remains a top chapter on the University of Arizona campus. Thanks to Matt & the whole FMG team.

The next step was to determine what the new Pi Phi House would look like. For this, CHC enlisted the services of CDG Architects, owned by Wildcat Frank Mascia (Pi Kappa Alpha). Frank-along with architect Ryan Repucci (also a "UArizona" Wildcat) and CDG project manager Cindy Hogan-spent a great deal of time meeting with CHC, chapter members and Arizona Alpha alumnae to make sure they understood how the updated facility would be used. The CDG team has remained steadfast in their commitment to design renovated spaces and a large addition to meets today's modern expectations, while maintaining the elegance and charm of our historic Joesler home. With vast proficiency, they have ensured

that the contractor has the drawings and technical specifications needed and that all city, county, state and federal requirements are being met. In addition, they've worked hard to ensure that our facility will be fully ADA compliant going forward ... and, Cindy keeps us all on task.



The final component to make this dream become reality was to secure a loan from a solid, insured lender. We were fortunate to have a couple of banks vying for our business, but in the end, we settled on Commerce Bank of Arizona. NAMING PLAQUE DESIGN

Hand-crafted copper!

Room naming plaques will be hand crafted out of hammered copper.

The room/area being named will be burnished into the copper, as will the name of the donor or group sponsoring the area.



- When joining forces with other sisters to name an area, donors who give \$500 or more can have their name included on a dangling name plate. Gifts can be spread out over 5 years.
- The above graphic is a example of a current room naming collaboration and includes the names of all donors who have pledged at least \$500 toward this group effort as of November 1st.
- By default, the dangling donor plates will be attached by amount given first, then year, then alphabetical. You can speak with Cece Derickson if you are interested in a different listing order.
