Outstanding House Director: Esther Salcido-Agredano

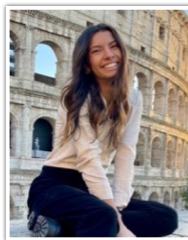

President's Report

Dear Sisters,

As the end of the semester approaches, I would like to formally recognize the accomplishments that have been made by the AZ Alpha Chapter of Pi Beta Phi despite the ongoing hardship, turmoil, and uncertainty associated with the pandemic. Through the challenges we have faced, our Chapter has stood strong, working with earnest endeavor to exemplify the aims of our Fraternity.

Integrity: Our chapter has demonstrated a consistent and uncompromised moral uprightness through our strict adherence to CDC guidelines over the last year; we were awarded the status of a Ready For You Emblem Business by Pima County for our excellence in this regard.

Lifelong Commitment: We are so proud of past AZ Alpha Chapter President, Stormmy Boettecher, to have been presented with the Order of Omega Young Alumni Award this year! Additionally, our Director of Lifelong Commitment and Vice President of Member Experience are currently working to plan a week dedicated to our senior class at the conclusion of the semester. Our soon-to-be graduates' dedication to and love for our chapter is undeniable, and while we are certainly disheartened to see them leave, we cannot wait to celebrate their achievements as AZ Alpha alumni.

Honor and Respect: The AZ Alpha Chapter stands in solidarity with the number of racist, xenophobic, and violent attacks on members of the AAPI and black communities within the last year. We intend to continue utilizing our platform and our voice by condemning these heinous acts, and providing educational resources and means of support for individuals affected by these blatant acts of discrimination and injustice. To cultivate an environment dedicated to embracing diversity and promoting inclusivity, our Director of Diversity and Inclusion has presented on a bi-weekly basis on issues related to DEI, hosted Teleparties to allow our chapter members to watch films/documentaries that highlight these issues, and developed effective programming throughout the months of February and March for Black and Women's History months, respectively. We are additionally proud to have formulated an official Diversity action plan, identifying ways in which we, both as a Chapter and as individuals, can be better enlightened on and take action against these inequalities.

Personal and Intellectual Growth: In February of 2021, a member of AZ Alpha was awarded the Excellence in Leadership and Involvement Scholarship for her contributions both to Pi Beta Phi and to the Panhellenic community, at large. Among panhellenic chapters, AZ Alpha had the 4th highest all-member GPA (3.511 on a 4.000 scale) in Fall of 2020. Additionally, 104 members received a GPA of 4.0 in the same semester. Many of our graduating seniors have been accepted into prestigious graduate programs and employment opportunities; we are excited to see all that they accomplish in their future endeavors!

Philanthropic Service to Others: Our Chapter is proud to have been nominated for and to have received a number of awards for our excellence in philanthropic service to others. In February, a member of AZ Alpha was presented with the Outstanding Volunteer award, and we, as a chapter, received the Outstanding Community Service award. We were also proud, in the same month, to have been crowned "The Menstruation Master" for our contributions towards the Diaper Bank of Southern Arizona through our involvement in the Love Period Campaign. Many members have become involved in the community in the last year through volunteering at COVID Vaccine pods, the American Red Cross, and animal shelters, to name a few. We are excited to again be supporting Read>Lead>Achieve in April, as we will be hosting a virtual Pie a Pi Phi event that will raise funds to promote literacy initiatives and a life-long love of reading.

Sincere Friendship: Despite the challenges that have come from living in a predominantly virtual world, AZ Alpha has been committed to maintaining member satisfaction and developing mechanisms by which members can continue to connect with one another through online modalities. We have started a Letter to a Sister program where members can send words of encouragement to their friends, and have organized virtual, and COVID-friendly in-person, sisterhood events, alike. We have been nominated for the Excellence in Member Experience Award for our efforts in this regard. We currently stand 341 members strong, and have consistently maintained one of the highest retention rates on our campus, further evidencing the genuine friendships bound by wine and silver blue.

Laura Robertson '84

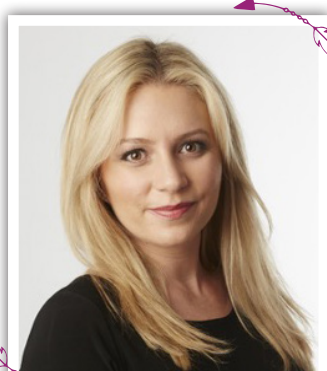
